THE TWINS: The Twins began their six-game roadtrip by getting swept in three games in Toronto...tonight, they will continue the trip with the first of three at Cleveland...following this series, the Twins will travel home to start a 10-game, 11-day homestand...the Twins have gone 25-40 at home and 24-41 on the road...the Twins are seeking their first win since last Wednesday, August 17 at Atlanta.

LOSING STREAK HITS DOUBLE DIGITS: The Twins lost to the Blue Jays yesterday afternoon by a score of 9-6, extending their losing streak to 10 games, their longest in a single season since May 14-24, 2013 (also 10)...Kyle Gibson was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing four runs on eight hits in 5.1 innings pitched...the offense recorded 10 hits as Brian Dozier doubled for the Twins lone extra-base hit.

ROSTER MOVE: The Twins announced yesterday that they have placed outfielder Danny Santana on the 15-day disabled list with a left shoulder AC joint sprain...he suffered the injury in the first inning yesterday when colliding with left-fielder Robbie Grossman...to replace Santana on the 25-man roster, the Twins have selected outfielder Logan Schafer from Triple-A Rochester...Schafer has appeared in 64 games for the Red Wings this season hitting .264 (57-for-216) with seven doubles, a triple, four home runs and 19 RBI...Schafer, who played in parts of five seasons from 2011-15 with the Milwaukee Brewers, was signed by the Twins as a minor league free agent on June 1...he will join the Twins in Cleveland and wear uniform number 32.

TWINS AND INDIANS: The Twins are playing the 14th of 19 games against the Indians and eighth of 10 at Progressive Field...they have gone 8-5 against the Indians this season, including a record of 5-2 at Cleveland...one win in this series would match their 2015 win total (6-4) at Cleveland; they have never won seven-plus in one season in this park...they are 15-7 in their last 22 against the Tribe.

☞ Their last series at Progressive Field was August 1-4 going 3-1...in that four-game series, they hit .357 (55-for-154) with 14 doubles, 10 home runs and 9.3 runs-per-game.

☞ Eddie Rosario has hit safely in each of his last 14 games against the Indians, hitting .351 (20-for-57) with three doubles, four home runs, 10 RBI and 13 runs scored in that span.

MAUER AND CLEVELAND: Joe Mauer is hitting .333 (199-for-598) in his career against Cleveland, with 41 doubles, 13 home runs, 74 RBI and a .421 on-base percentage...among actives vs. the Tribe, he ranks first in walks (92), second in hits and on-base percentage, third in doubles, and fourth in batting average.

☞ He has reached safely in 15 of his last 21 plate appearances against the Indians.

IT'S DOZIER'S WORLD: Brian Dozier is hitting .309 (79-for-256) with 19 doubles, five triples, 23 home runs, 53 RBI and 54 runs scored in his last 63 games, since June 18...since that date, he ranks first in baseball in home runs (23), extra-base hits (47) and total bases (177), second in runs scored (54), tied for fourth in RBI (53) and tied for 10th in hits (79)...additionally, he has 11 home runs this month; below are the Twins records for homers in a month.

THE PLOUFFE IS ON FIRE: Trevor Plouffe is hitting .333 (16-for-48) with four doubles, two home runs and 13 RBI in his last 12 games...in that span, he is hitting .353 (12-for-34) against right-handed pitching and .378 (14-for-37) on the road.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 1963, the Twins hit a club record with eight home runs in one game vs. Washington...the home runs were hit by Vic Power (2), Harmon Killebrew (2), Bob Alison, Jimmie Hall, Bernie Allen and Rich Rollins...in 1990, Greg Gagne homered and stole three bases, including home, in a 6-1 win over the White Sox; Mark Guthrie went the distance for the win...in 1996, the Twins traded third baseman Dave Hollins to Seattle for a player to be named later, which turned out to be David Ortiz.

BUXTON NAMED IL POW: Rochester Red Wings outfielder Byron Buxton has been named International League Batter of the Week for the second time this season...Buxton hit in all seven games during the week and had multiple hits in four of those...he hit .353 (12-for-35) with a double, four home runs, eight RBI and eight runs scored...the four home runs and 25 total bases led the league while the eight runs scored tied for the league lead...Buxton scored at least one run in each game during the period and became the second Red Wing to homer in four consecutive games in 2016, going deep from August 24-27...overall with Rochester, Buxton is batting .320 with 11 doubles, three triples, 11 home runs, 23 RBI, 41 runs scored and seven stolen bases in 46 games this season...he is hitting .292 (19-for-65) since being optioned on August 8...a Red Wing has earned IL batter or pitcher of the week five times this season, including Buxton twice...Adam Brett Walker, Andrew Albers and Jose Berrios were also honored earlier in 2016.

LAST START: Santiago made his fourth start as a Twin and was dealt his fourth straight loss August 20 at Kansas City...surrendered eight runs on 11 hits with two strikeouts and no walks in 4.2 innings...gave up three runs in the third inning on a single and three doubles...allowed a solo home run to Alex Gordon in the fourth...gave up four runs in the fifth, and was relieved by Adalberto Mejia with two outs after giving up back-to-back home runs to Salvador Perez and Alex Gordon...is 0-4 in four starts since joining the Twins August 1 after winning his final six starts with Los Angeles-AL.

CLEVELAND ROCKED: Santiago is making his third start this season against Cleveland and second as a member of the Twins...made his Twins debut against the Indians on August 4th at Progressive Field, allowing four runs, all earned, on five hits and two walks in 5.0 innings in a 9-2 loss...2-3 with a 6.10 ERA (41.1 IP, 28 ER) in 13 career appearances against the Indians, the last eight of them starts...2-1 with a 3.54 ERA (20.1 IP, 8 ER) and one save in five career appearances at Progressive Field, the last three of them starts.

WALK IT OFF: Since joining the Twins August 1, Santiago has walked just three batters in 19.0 innings over four starts for a 1.42 walk-per-9.0 innings ratio...he issued 57 walks in 120.2 innings over 22 starts with the Angels this season for a 4.25 BB/9...he did not walk a batter in each of his last two starts; he had done so only once prior this season...Santiago has walked four-or-more in seven starts this year, including a season-high six walks in his last start with Los Angeles-AL July 30 vs. Boston.

BETTER UNDER PRESSURE: Santiago has held batters to a .237 (28-for-118) batting average with runners in scoring position this season...opponents are batting .231 (12-for-52) with runners in scoring position and two outs...has a career batting average against of .199 (107-for-539) with runners in scoring position.

PICKING HIS SPOTS: Santiago is tied for fifth in all of baseball with four pickoffs this season...Ricky Nolasco leads the Twins with three pickoffs in 2016...Tommy Milone, Michael Tonkin and Kyle Gibson each have two pickoffs this season, and Jose Berrios has one.

HOTTER THAN JULY: Santiago went 6-0, 1.78 ERA (35.1 IP, 7 ER) with 21 walks and 34 strikeouts in six starts in July, the most wins in baseball during that stretch and the fourth-best ERA in the American League...became the first Angels pitcher to go 6-0 in any calendar month since Jered Weaver in July 2012...just the second Angels lefty to go at least 6-0 in a calendar month, joining Chuck Finley, who went 7-0 in July 1997...also, the first AL lefty to go 6-0 in a calendar month since Andy Pettitte for the Yankees in August 2007...a Twin has won at least six games in a month 16 different times, and eight of those instances were also undefeated months...the most recent six-game winner for the Twins was Johan Santana, who was 6-0 with a 2.08 ERA (43.1 IP, 10 ER) in August 2004.

GET TO KNOW 'EM: Santiago joined the Twins organization Monday, August 1 just prior to the non-waiver trade deadline...Minnesota sent RHP Ricky Nolasco, RHP Alex Meyer and cash to Los Angeles-AL in exchange for Santiago and RHP Alan Benes...previously played for the Angels from 2014-16 and Chicago-AL from 2011-13...named a 2015 All-Star, one of three Angels representatives along with Mike Trout and Albert Pujols...debuted July 6, 2011 vs. Kansas City in relief; made two relief appearances in 2011...began 2012 season as the White Sox closer before making his first career start September 3, 2012 vs. the Twins...twice nominated for annual Roberto Clemente Award, in 2013 with Chicago and in 2015 with Los Angeles...has hosted "Santiago's Soldiers" inner-city baseball teams in Chicago and Los Angeles.

HECTOR ON YOUR SIDE: Santiago was 3-2 with a 4.19 ERA (34.1 IP, 16 ER) in 10 career appearances (six starts) against the Twins...beat the Twins 10-2 on June 15 in Anaheim, scattering two hits and two walks over 6.0 innings of one-run ball...among current Twins, Joe Mauer has the most at-bats against Santiago with 16 and is tied with Brian Dozier and Kurt Suzuki for most hits with five...John Ryan Murphy is the only member of the Twins 40-man roster with a home run off Santiago.

YOU'VE GOT TWO SIXES: Santiago is the first player in Twins history to wear number 66...only worn by one other player in franchise history, Senators pitcher Ray Scarborough in 1942...was previously worn by interim coaches Steve Liddle (1999), Jake Mauer (2015) and Eric Rasmussen (2016).

- Named Angels nominee for 2015 Roberto Clemente Award in recognition for his positive contributions to community both on and off the field.
- Named to 2015 American League All-Star Team as a member of the Angels...had a 6-4 record and 2.33 ERA in 2015's first half...did not pitch in All-Star Game in Cincinnati.
- Made one relief appearance for the Angels in the 2014 ALDS vs. KC...pitched 1.1 innings in Game 3 at Kauffman Stadium and allowed two earned runs on one hit (Hosmer HR) with two walks.
- Traded to Los Angeles-AL December 10, 2013 with LHP Tyler Skaggs in three-team deal which sent OF Mark Trumbo and RHP A.J. Schugel to Arizona and OF Adam Eaton to Chicago-AL.
- On October 1, 2012 at Cleveland, became second rookie since 2000 to record 10-or-more strikeouts while allowing two-or-fewer baserunners in a start (also, Johnny Cueto).
- Made Major League debut July 6, 2011 for Chicago-AL vs. Kansas City with 1.0 scoreless inning of relief...began 2012 season as White Sox closer...converted four of six opportunities.
- Was originally drafted by the Chicago White Sox in the 30th round of the 2006 First Year Player Draft out of Okaloosa-Walton College in Niceville, FL.
